



SCHOOL RULES

1. BEHAVIOUR

The safety and health of others is our priority at all times.

- 1. 1 Respect for and consideration of the rights of others is expected from everyone at our school.
- 1. 2 Good manners and politeness are expected from all learners at all times.
- 1. 3 No discriminatory or bad language (swearing/blasphemy) may be used.
- 1. 4 Be responsible for your own belongings.
- 1. 5 Treat others the way you want them to treat you.
- 1. 6 No weapons of any kind are allowed to be brought to school.
- 1. 7 Learners may not threaten another child either verbally or physically.
- 1. 8 No contact games may be played at school.
- 1. 9 No fighting or bullying in any form whatsoever is permitted at our school.
- 1.10 Name-calling, teasing or rudeness will not be tolerated.
- 1.11 Chewing gum is not allowed on the school premises.
- 1.12 No learner may disrupt lessons, or prevent other children from learning by disturbing the class on a regular basis.

2. SCHOOL PROPERTY

- 2.1 Walk on pathways and inside buildings.
- 2.2 Look after all school property (such as books, furniture and equipment).
- 2.3 No climbing of walls, gates or fences, or playing in an out-of-bounds area is allowed.
- 2.4 No food, games or books may be taken inside the toilet areas.
- 2.5 Toilets must be used correctly and with consideration for others.
- 2.6 Keep the school grounds and buildings clean and tidy.

3. SCHOOL UNIFORM & GENERAL APPEARANCE

- 3.1 Only watches (and 1 pair of plain earrings for girls) may be worn to school. No other jewellery is allowed without the principal's permission.
- 3.2 Tracking watches must be silent and no calls / messages may be made or received between 08:00 and 13:15.
- 3.3 The Principal must be notified in writing if 'Medic Alert' bracelets or chains are worn. All requests to wear religious insignia are to be made in writing.
- 3.4 No exotic hair styles, hi-lighted or dyed hair. **(see Uniform)**
- 3.5 **Civvies Days:** No make-up, jewellery, high heels or outrageous clothes may be worn. Clothing must be modest. Long hair still needs to be tied up.

- 3.6 The correct school uniform must be worn each day. Learners are expected to be clean and neatly dressed when they arrive at school. Shirts must be tucked into skirts / trousers. The correct socks and footwear must be worn.
Laces must be neatly tied to prevent accidents.
- 3.7 Hair and nails should be kept clean. Fingernails are to be kept short.
- 3.8 On PT days, the blue T-shirt and navy blue shorts must be worn to school with white short socks and appropriate PT shoes (trainers / takkies).
- 3.9 Uniforms should fit comfortably. Very tight pants or very short skirts may not be worn to school. Please repair or replace broken clothing and shoes.

4. CELL PHONES, GAMES & TOYS

- 4.1 Cell phones are not allowed at school.
- 4.2 All toys, games, playing cards of any sort, etc. must be left at home unless permission to bring that object to school for a specific lesson is given by the class or Aftercare teacher. Toy or real weapons (knives, guns, swords, etc.) may never be brought onto the school premises under any circumstances. If a weapon is 'needed' for show-and-tell, it may only be in the form of a picture or cardboard cut-out.
- 4.3 Any cell phone or unauthorised object found in a learner's possession while on the school grounds will be confiscated and only returned at the end of that term. Should the item be viewed as dangerous, the parent will be contacted to collect this.

5. GENERAL SAFETY

- 5.1 Once they arrive at school, learners may not leave the school grounds before the end of their school day without a teacher or parent's permission.
- 5.2 Any child who is found to be a continual danger to himself / herself, or who endangers the health or safety of other children, will be asked to leave the school with immediate effect.
- 5.3 Right of Admission onto school premises is reserved. Only paying learners will be able to enter the school grounds. No unauthorised visitors are allowed on the premises while children are at school.

My parent / guardian has discussed the school rules for Mulbarton Remedial with me and I agree to keep to the rules as set out by the school for my own safety and the safety of others.

As parent / guardian I will endeavour to ensure that my child obeys the school rules, especially those over which I have control such as the chewing gum ban, hairstyle, appropriate school uniform and toys or cell phones.
